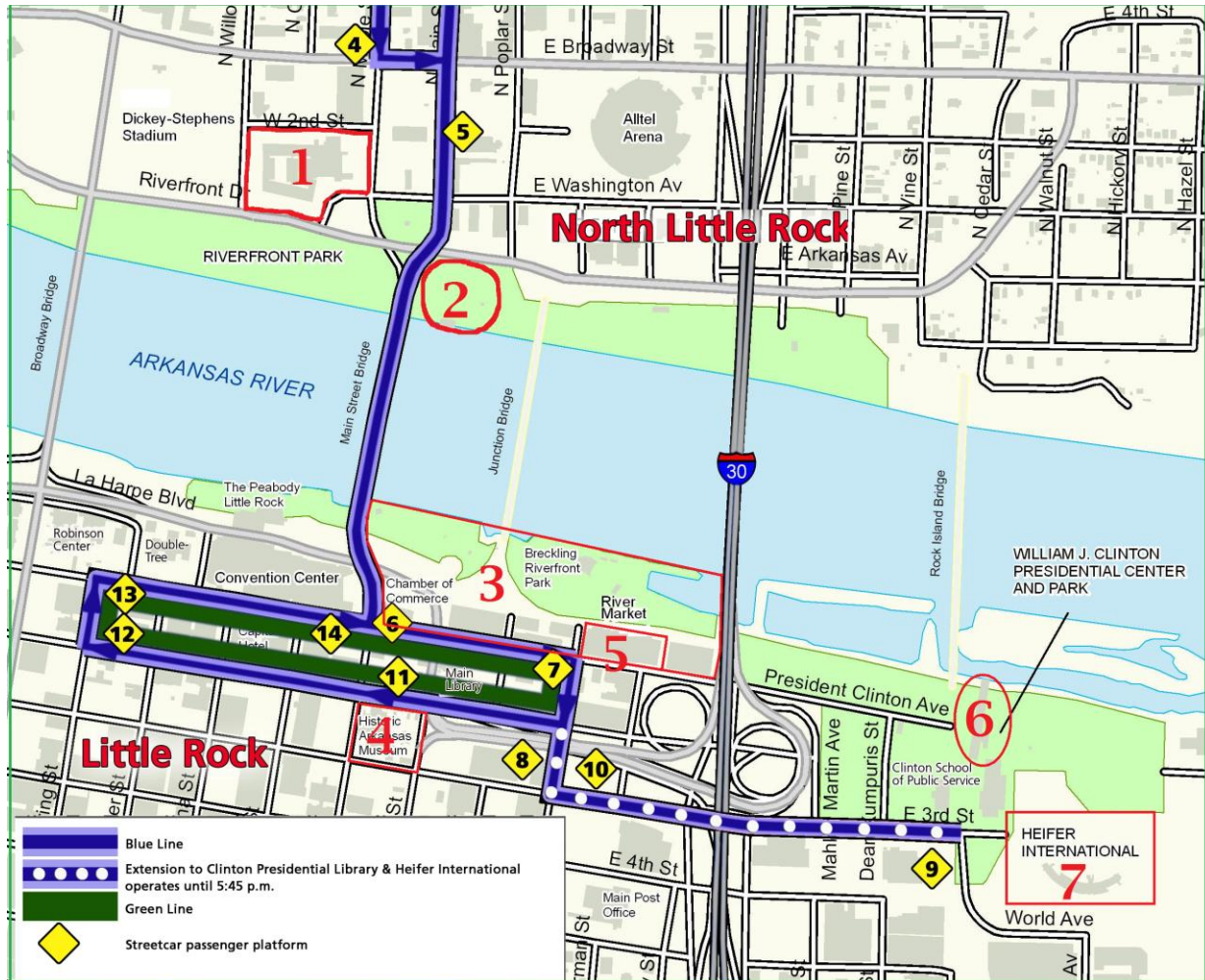


# SWAAG 2009

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## Accommodations

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1. Conference Hotel: Wyndham Riverfront, Little Rock:

Free airport shuttle, right on the river, restaurants, steak house, and Benihana Japanese Restaurant on property, and a 2 minute walk from a fine, Irish Pub (think Guinness on draft)

Three minute walk from a River Rail Streetcars stop. Real trolleys, steel rails, overhead electric lines, \$1 for loop through town, or \$2 for all day

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## On the trolley line

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2. USS Razorback; a WWII era submarine open for tours.
3. River Market District (nightlife center of LR), 5 to 10 minutes on trolley line or 15 minute walk; many restaurants, music, micro brewery, Flying Saucer Beer Emporium, etc.

4. Museums featuring Arkansas History:

Historic Arkansas Museum: Several buildings from pre-Civil War, Living History museum (i.e. period costumed characters lead tours)

Old State House Museum: oldest surviving state capitol west of Mississippi (and from SWAAG's perspective, did anything of importance ever happen east of the Mississippi!?!), tours and exhibits

5. Museum of Discovery: Children's Museum
6. Clinton Presidential Center/Museum
7. Heifer International: Major international aid/development agency with one of the most "green" buildings in the US, tours; next to Clinton Library.

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## Other attractions within a short drive or cab ride

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Central High Visitor Center: NPS center with displays, videos, etc. about the famous Central High crisis of 1957 and its pivotal role in the Civil Rights Movement.

Pinnacle Mountain State Park: hiking, arboretum, and a strenuous climb/hike to the top for a fine vista from the Eastern flanks of the Ouachita Mountains.
